- point out what you think is good or bad about the approach and why you think so
- cite to prove what you write
 - · This means mentioning the literature you use

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How to fail a seminar



- Plagiarism
 - The supervisors know the papers you collected, so copy and paste stuff from them
 - If you find a similar paper copy sentences like "We propose in our method..."
 - If you cite, cite whole chapters
- Deadlines are for losers, delay everything as long as possible
- Don't attend the seminar talks...the other students will be thankful for one member less in the audience
- Write your paper in a funny grammatical and spelling style
- Present stuff that has nothing to do with your topic
- Present your topic just based on your starting paper and praise everything ignoring how ridiculous it is...



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
